




## **NEEDS YOUR HELP !**

National AMC of A membership dues for the 1997 membership year are \$ 20.00 single; \$ 25.00 with spouse. A \$ 1.00 service charge is made for handling an applicant's National application.

Distribution of YANKEE CHATTER is to members of record in good standing (paid up), officers and directors of the AMC of A, and certain editors and other officers of the AMC of A Chapters. As a member of the National AMC of A, YANKEE Chapter is a non-profit organization.






Anyone entering the back gate at Jim Darby's Stafford Springs Swap Meet found Duane Brown and Jim Darby conversing with Rhonda.


