





#### THEODORE A. HODGDON — 1901-1984



#### MINUTES of the YANKEE Chapter Business Meeting

Held at the Squash Inn, Moosup, Connecticut

December 2, 1984

The meeting was called to order at 1:00 P.M. by Chapter Director Alan Tonges, who opened his remarks by submitting his resignation to become effective immediately, because of understandable personal obligations and commitments. He then handed the gavel over to Paul Santopietro who presided over the meeting from that point.

The next item on the agenda was one of nominations from the floor to fill the vacancy thus created. It was noted that should one of the Vice Directors be elected as Chapter Director, a second vacancy would then be created (that of Vice Director), and it was agreed that from the nominees, whoever received the most number of votes would become Director, and whoever received the second highest number of votes would fill the vacated Vice Directorship. The nominees were: John Pierce (who was absent from the meeting, but who had previously voiced his willingness to serve); Rudy J. Litke; and Paul Santopietro. The results of the subsequent voting by secret ballot was John Pierce for Chapter Director; Paul Santopietro for Vice Director.

The next order of business was the selection of the Chapter logo from the 34 numbered designs which had been submitted by YANKEE members and which were displayed for all to inspect and vote on. Voting was by secret ballot and No. 21, submitted by Paul Santopietro was the winner. He requested that his prize of \$ 20.00 covering Chapter and National memberships for 1985 be retained in the Club Treasury. The chosen design was then given to Charlene Peirce to have camera-ready copy made for continuing Chapter use.

Giles Adams brought to the meeting the old Chapter sign which needs to be refinished before it can be used at future activities and Chuck Schmidt volunteered for this assignment.

A discussion on camping fees for 1985 followed, and \$ 5.00 per site for members and their guests was agreed upon, with a note that members will be responsible for their quests.

George Yarocki presented some National AMC of A news, including a list of 10 new rules, National signs, and the new National constitution (copies of which will be sent to members shortly). George also displayed a copy of the new AMC of A Subject Index prepared by Doug Strange (see also YANKEE PEDLAR this issue for AMC of A ad).

The question of spouse membership was brought up and discussed at some length. It was finally decided to charge \$ 7.50 for member and spouse, both to have voting privileges, and to share one copy of the newsletter per couple. This matter was carried by a show of hands, 18 to 9.

Adding a bit of comic relief to the meeting, Bob Peirce then presented out-going Chapter Director Alan Tonges with an "early photo of him" taken at the Reading Speedway in Pennsylvania, Also, the newsletter staff's favorite photo of 1984 - The Wienie Biters, Chuck Schmidt and Dan Whitcomb - was shown, and color copies presented to each of them by George Yarocki.

Next on the agenda, George Yarocki stated that he would like to ask Fred Hirsch to consider taking over the task of editing the newsletter, since Rudy  $\check{\mathsf{J}}$ . Litke had decided to step down because of other commitments. Fred accepted with the overwhelming support of all in attendance. Chapter appreciation was extended to Rudy and George and Milli Yarocki for their efforts in editing, preparing and sending out the 1984 issues of YANKEE CHATTER.

The most important order of business was then discussed our YANKEE Chapter National Meet which will be held in Acton, Maine on June 29-30.


The closing Treasury balance for the year 1984 was \$ 566.92 with over 40 memberships already received.




