Distribution of YANKEE CHATTER is to members of record in good standing (paid up), officers and directors of the AMC of A, and certain editors and other officers of the AMC of A Chapters. As a member of the National AMC of A, YANKEE Chapter is a non-profit organization.

In other business, an officers meeting is scheduled at the April 2 swap meet in Stafford Springs for 1:00 p.m.. Jim Darby volunteered to find us a meeting space, if possible. Jim is also offering FREE ADMISSION to anyone sporting an A.M.C. card.

Marty Hansen is relinquishing the duties of editor to Charlie Gallo. Thanks, Marty, for handling one of the most difficult responsibilities in our club. Good luck, Charlie!

The meeting adjourned at approximately 3:30 p.m. after lunch provided by Randy Walker. Our thanks go out to Randy for accommodating us and for his hospitality.

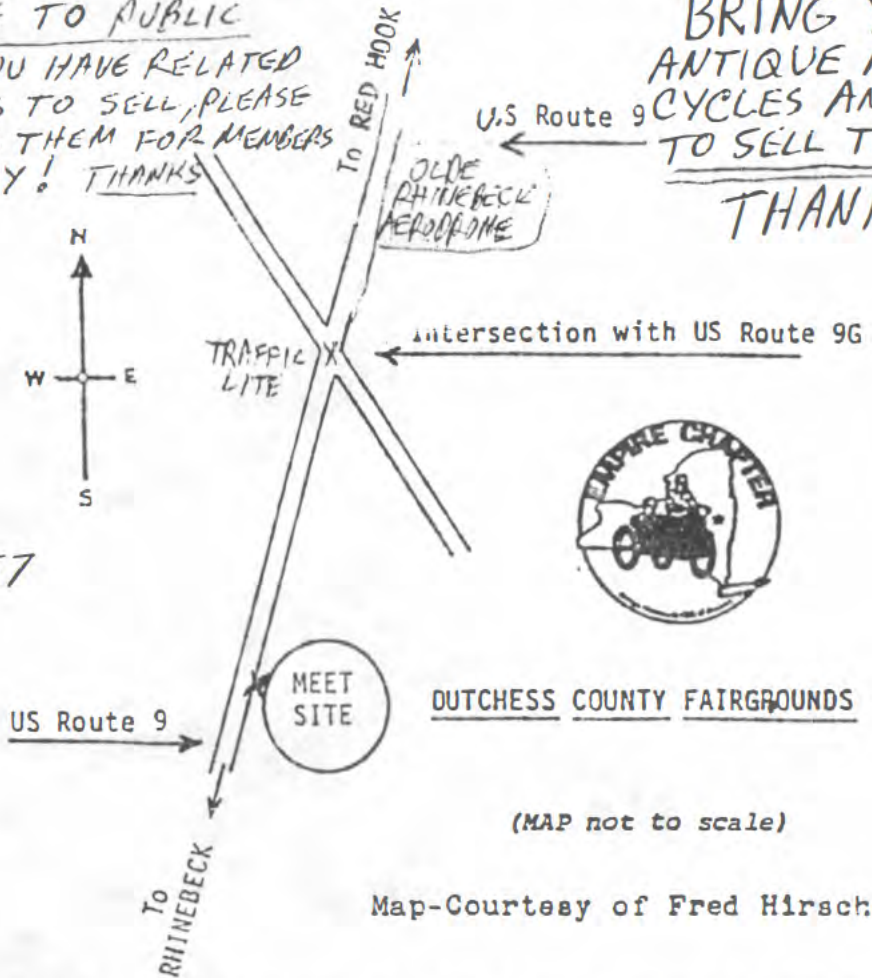

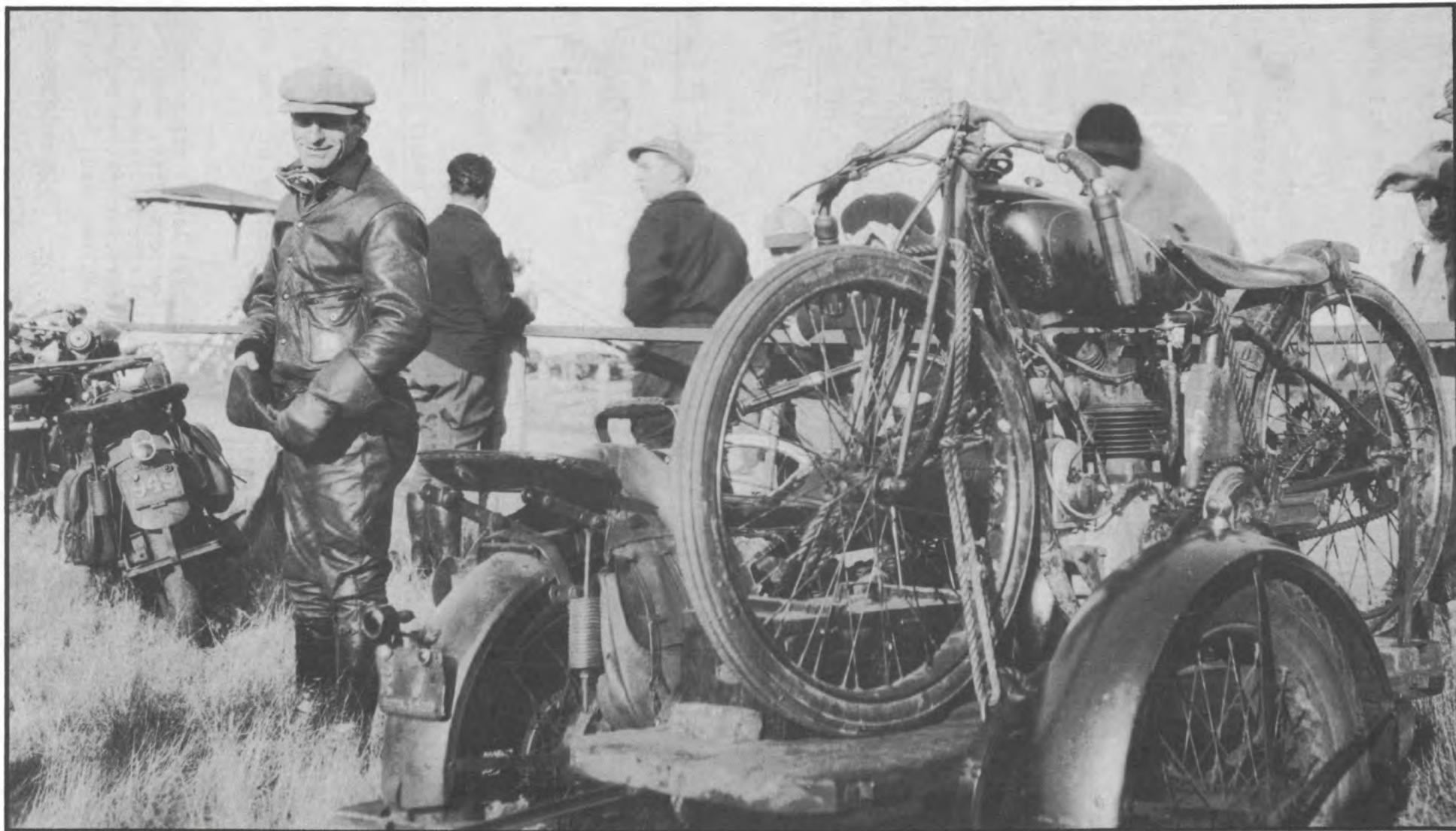

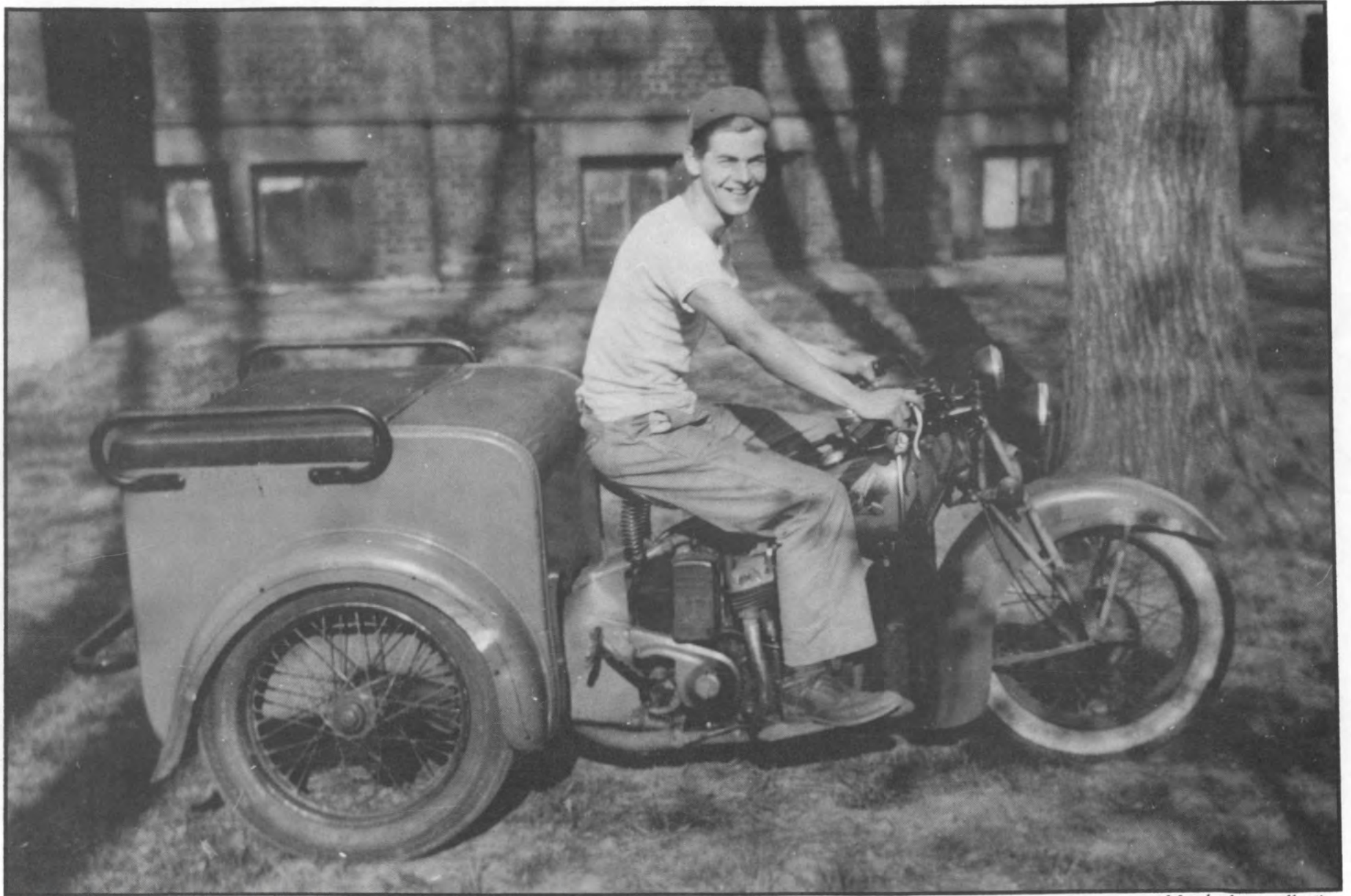

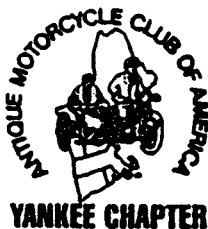

- 10 - ZIP Codes - Use ALL 9 digits where known or shown.
- 11 - DO NOT ADD ANYTHING below the City, State and ZIP Code line.

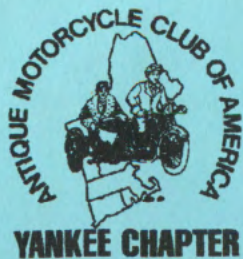

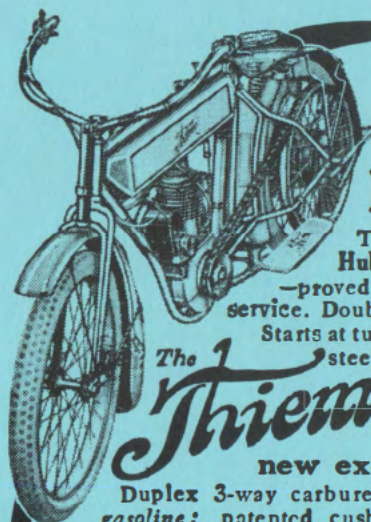
