



Distribution of YANKEE CHATTER is to members of record in good standing (paid up), officers and directors of the AMC of A, and certain editors and other officers of the AMC of A Chapters. As a member of the National AMC of A, YANKEE Chapter is a non-profit organization.



Access to this meet is very easy. The DUTCHESS COUNTY FAIRGROUNDS is located in charmand historic Rhinebeck, New York on the east side of the Hudson River and the east side US Route 9 between Rhinebeck and Red Hook going north. Use any convenient map route to ive in the general area then:


- m SOUTH Proceed to Poughkeepsie, New York by any chosen route; then follow US Route 9 NORTH until you pass through Rhinebeck. The DUTCHESS COUNTY FAIRGROUNDS is approximately 1 mile from Rhinebeck on the Right.
- NORTH Proceed to the Hudson/Catskill general area (south of Albany). Consult map to locate US Route 9; then take US Route 9 SOUTH until you pass through Red Hook and the intersection with US Route 9G. The DUTCHESS COUNTY FAIRGROUNDS is approximately 1 mile from this intersection on the Left.

m any other direction - Proceed by any chosen route to arrive at US Route 9; then fellow whichever of the above directions is applicable.




