

Distribution of YANKEE CHATTER is to members of record in good standing (paid up), officers and directors of the AMC of A, and certain editors and other officers of the AMC of A Chapters. As a member of the National AMC of A, YANKEE Chapter is a non-profit organization.



Randy Walker has taken over the duties of chapter deputy judge in addition to his treasurer's responsibilities. The officers were elected to their posts with the unanimous approval of the membership.

After the elections, we had a real surprise. Nate Sheldon, the acting president of the New England Motorcycle Dealers Association, presented the Yankee Chapter with a gift of five thousand dollars on behalf of the association. The association is disbanding and is distributing their funds to worthy organizations. Bob Frink, who is the secretary of the association, assisted in the presentation. Thanks from us all, to Nate, Bob and the other members of the association.

There was some discussion of our upcoming meets. Our National meet is scheduled for August 2-4, 1996 at Hebron, CT. A chapter meet will be held in September, 1996 at a date to be determined later.

After the meeting was adjourned, we all got plenty to eat. As always, there were all sorts of excellent foods to choose from and no one left hungry.

Secretary's Report

Minutes of the Yankee Chapter business meeting held at the home of Randy Walker in Brookfield, MA on 21 January, 1996:

The meeting was called to order at 1:25 P.M. by Director Jessie Jacaruso. Present were Jessie Jacaruso, Fred Hirsch, Dave Howland, Bob Frink, Bill Campbell, Charlie Gallo, Marty Hansen, Jim Friedlander, Tom Marston, Randy Walker and Joan Kadulis.

Randy Walker presented a treasury report to start the meeting. He stated that there is currently \$14,836.00 in the account and that we have 70 members signed up for the year. Included in this figure are members and spouses. It was unanimously decided, after discussion, to move \$8,000. of the treasury money into a higher yield account for better interest accrual purposes.

The next order of business was to determine the theme for the 1996 National Meet, along with other sundries involved. A sub-topic popped up, that being, "Staff Shirts". It was decided that there will be Staff Shirts for those members contributing 6 hours of work at the National Meet. Options in the future discussed at this time included sending in for 1997 National Meet dates and whether or not to have a meet or a road run in 1998. Fear of losing meet dates or status brought up discussion of a non-national sanctioned road run as opposed to field games. This year's theme, using clever advertising to bring in a variety of motorcycles, was decided by unanimous vote to be "Honoring Motorcycles From Around The World". Bill Campbell offered an antique pin to be used in creating pins for the meet. With the variety of motorcycles apt to show up, we could have a judges' nightmare. We should be able to draw some odd makes out of the woodwork, just by those who would like to test the judges and the judging system. Hopefully, the whole orginization will be enriched by the knowledge gained in examining the rare makes.

The "little" details of the meet: shirt colors, options on where to obtain them, meet signs, corral signs, vendor's forms, master map of meet and space sizes were discussed. Decisions were: bright shirts, continue to obtain them where we have in the past, all set with both meet signs and corral signs, master map to be updated, and space layout determined. It was also decided that this year we would do a road run as opposed to field games. Marty Hansen and Jim Friedlander volunteered to run the road run. Dave Howland and Bill Campbell will be in charge of gate organization. Charlie Gallo nominated Randy Walker for Chief Chapter Judge. The nomination was seconded and passed unanimously.

Membership paperwork was discussed and it was determined that we will continue to use our existing membership forms even though the National AMC of A has converted to a set of computerized forms. To alleviate any problems, membership forms will show check number, all pertinent information and phone number in the upper right corner of the form.

In delegating responsibilities, Bill Campbell will be in charge of vendor pre-registration. Jessie Jacaruso will take care of shirts, pins, etc..

Site preparation will take place on the preceding Thursday. Bill Campbell will work on obtaining a public address system. Discussion on having a diversity of food was not resolved. Possibly there will be an award for the best tropical or exotic shirt as part of our around the world theme.

Finally, the Yankee Chapter Autumn Meet was discussed. It will be held in Sturbridge, MA on either the second or third weekend of September. Tom Marston will lay out a 40 to 50 mile road run for the meet.

The next business meeting will take place on March 31 at 1:00 PM at Bill Campbell's vending spot during Jim Darby's meet at Stafford Springs, CT.

The meeting adjourned at approximately 2:45 PM, after which we enjoyed good food, provided by Randy. Randy, we all thank you for you hospitality.





HOW to Get There

Access to this meet is very easy. The DUTCHESS COUNTY FAIRGROUNDS is located in charming and historic Rhinebeck, New York on the east side of the Hudson River and the east side of US Route 9 between Rhinebeck and Red Hook going north. Use any convenient map route to arrive in the general area then:

- From SOUTH Proceed to Poughkeepsie, New York by any chosen route; then follow US Route 9 NORTH until you pass through Rhinebeck. The DUTCHESS COUNTY FAIRGROUNDS is approximately 1 mile from Rhinebeck on the Right.
- From NORTH Proceed to the Hudson/Catskill general area (south of Albany). Consult map to locate US Route 9; then take US Route 9 SOUTH until you pass through Red Hook and the intersection with US Route 9G. The DUTCHESS COUNTY FAIRGROUNDS is approximately 1 mile from this intersection on the Left.
- From any other direction Proceed by any chosen route to arrive at US Route 9; then follow whichever of the above directions is applicable.


